Early Years

Go for a walk in the street where you live.

What numbers can you spot?

Can you find 10 different things that are green?

How many windows does your house have?

How many cars are parked in your street?



Early Years

Go outside and sit quietly in different places, such as the garden, a park at the bus stop. Listen to the sounds you can hear. Can you identify who or what is making the sound? Do you hear the same or different sounds in each place? Why? You could draw pictures to show the most common and least common sounds.



Years 1 and 2

This school year has looked very different. Can you write down your favourite memories from the year? What did you enjoy most about the autumn, spring and summer terms?

Now you know who your teacher will be in September, you could write them a letter telling them all about yourself and what you like to do. You could even send it to school in the post or via the website, your teachers would love to read them.

Years 1 and 2

With a home grown-up, carry out a traffic survey in Yapton or where you live.

Stand in different parts of the village for 5 minutes and record how many vehicles you see.

Which place is the quietest/ busiest? What is the most common vehicle you spotted?

You could record your results as a bar chart or pictogram.

What are the geographical features of Yapton? Is it a city, town or village? Does it have any factories, farms or shops? Why might people choose to live in Yapton?

Use Google Maps to explore Yapton from above and street level. Can you find our school?
